Key Vocabulary

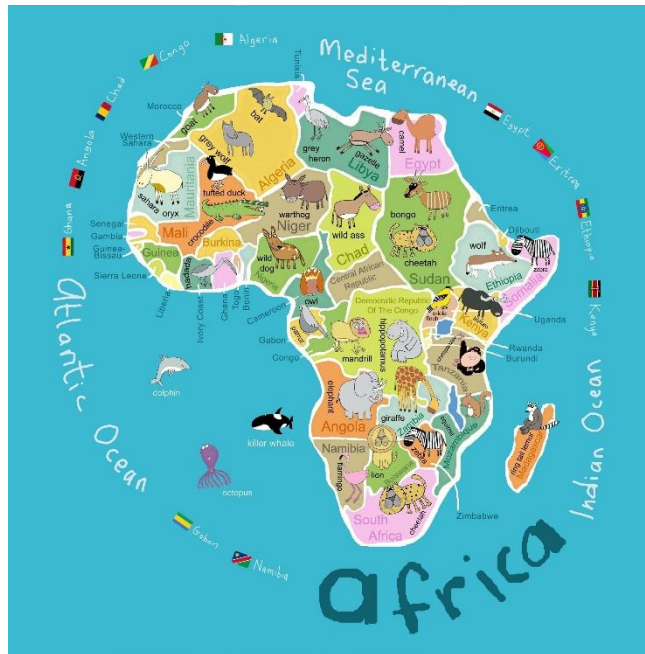
Desert, equator, safari, continent, Africa, country, climate, ocean, rainforest, savannah grasslands, Sahara, Nile, landmarks

Continent	A big space of land containing lots of different countries. There are 7 on Earth.
Country	An area smaller than a continent where lots of people live.
Desert	A large, sandy area of land.
Equator	The hottest part of the world, the part of the Earth closest to the sun. The equator runs through Africa.
Landmarks	An object or place that everyone recognises, like the Pyramids of Giza.
Ocean	A huge area of water, where all the seas meet. There are 5 oceans on Earth.
Nile	The longest river in Africa and the world.
Rainforest	A large forest with lots of rain, usually in hot countries.
Sahara	The largest desert in Africa.
Savanna grassland	A large area of grass where animals like to live.
