



History- Crime and Punishment.

- Find out about everyday lives of people in time studied.

- Observe small details-artefacts, pictures etc.

- Identify key features and events of time studied.
- Offer a reasonable explanation for some events.
- Use terms related to the topic and begin to date events
- Look at evidence available.

- Identify that commands have an outcome.
- Explain that a program has a start.
- Recognise that a sequence of commands can have an order.
- Create a program to move a sprite in four directions.
- Explain what repeat means.
- Decompose a task into small steps.
