



Geography Skills

- Use picture maps, atlases or globes.
- Use non-fiction books as sources of information.
- Ask simple questions – where is it? What is it like?
- Make simple comparisons between features of different, contrasting places – local area and non-European country.
- Find land/sea on a globe, atlas or picture map.
- Recognise a continent and some countries within it.
- Find the equator and hot/cold climates.

PSHE Skills

- Identify who is special to us and why.
- Understand groups which they belong to (including ‘communities’)
- Explain that families can look different.

Computing Skills

- Understand what algorithms are.
- Create and debug simple programs.
- Predict the behaviour of simple programs.

Science Skills

- Identify and name a variety of common animals and how they are suited to their environment.
- Identify which animals are carnivores, herbivores or omnivores.
- Classify animals into groups (mammals, reptiles, fish, birds, amphibians, insects)

Art Skills

- Use a range of materials creatively to design and make products including digital art.
- Experiment with arranging, overlapping and regular/irregular patterns with natural and manmade objects.
- Pinch and coil clay and experiment with decorative techniques.

Music Skills

- Learn familiar songs and perform in a group.

RE Skills

- Identify a special time and explain what celebration means.
- Identify ways in which people celebrate.
- Ask questions about celebrations.
